
The year 2020 has been quite eventful. The rising pandemic and sudden lockdown have had a tremendous impact on the lives of people. All the preordained activities



# 42nd Annual General Body Meeting



# act alliance

ACT Alliance is a global alliance of World Council of Churches (WCC) and Lutheran World Federation (LWF) member churches and related organisations committed to working ecumenically. During this reporting year, CARD became a permanent member of ACT (Action by Churches Together) Alliance, which came into effect on 1st January 2010 after the merging of ACT Development and ACT International, the relief and rehabilitation wing of the world ecumenical organisations. This membership opens the opportunity to CARD and the Mar Thoma Church to become active participants and partners in developmental and relief work in India, especially in the Northern states along with other major Church based NGOs.

## **MAJOR ACTIVITIES**

CARD continues with its activities through different programmes and projects working in 7 states of India including Kerala, Karnataka. Tamil Nadu, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Odisha, and Uttar Pradesh. The main programmes include CARD Care, Light to Life, Food security and agricultural development, gender equality and women empowerment, HIV/AIDs prevention, water conservation, and biodiversity protection, climate change, Community Development, livelihood support through SHG's/JLGs and these programmes have become a catalyst for positive change.

#### 1. CARD CARE

CARD Care is committed to building and strengthening partnerships with donors and local

sponsors who have been enabling the organisation to help more children by supporting specific interventions to overcome the disadvantages and discrimination they face in everyday life.

CARD Care is a project which encourages educational support for the poor and needy. This year onwards CARD decided to start a new scheme under the CARD Care programme for the students who are doing their higher education. We provided financial support for 16 students by helping with their fee payment for one year. CARD Care also distributed 209 free school education kits to poor children during the reporting year. The aim of the CARD Care ministry is to enable and empower children through proper education.





#### 2.CARD-LIGHT OF LIFE

Light to Life project was started in October 2017 in collaboration with North America &n Europe Diocese under the leadership of Rt.Rev.Dr.Isaac Mar Philoxenos Episcopa. In India, the majority of the children from rural areas, slums and urban poor families, scheduled castes, and tribal communities suffer from poverty, malnutrition, poor access to quality health services, child marriage, poor school attendance, low learning outcomes, lack of sanitation. Due to these challenges, the children are forced to drop their schools and studies mid-way.

In this context, The Light to Life programme aims at the holistic development of children in remote places in India. The programme has 1100 students in 7 states and 8 projects across India.

The various states in India where this project is employed include:

- 1. Chhattisgarh (Ameri)
- 2. Odisha (Kalahandi)
- 3. Kerala (Vattavada, iduki)
- 4. Kerala (Nadavayal, Wayanad)

- 5. Madhyapradesh (Kshipra)
- 6. Tamil Nadu (Shenkottai)
- 7. Maharashtra (Palsai)
- 8. Haryana (Sapera

The project prepared a curriculum for the proper support and care for children from child-hood to adolescence. Support at various levels including, physical, emotional, educational leads to healthy living. For strengthening the unprivileged, backward communities, we need continuous support to uplift them and bring them to the mainstream.

Some of the contributions of CARD for this aim are medical checkups, medical camps assessment in education, counseling, observation of national /international days, awareness classes, competition like sports, dances, quiz, educational trips, yoga, summer camps, and



provision for nutritious food and hygiene kits.

This project was the first respondent of Covid -19 mitigation works for Children and Communities in their area. People were provided with awareness classes, masks, sanitizers, and food kits were distributed. March onwards the project started Covid -19 mitigation works.

#### 3. CARD - ERIC

#### CARD - Gram Shakti CFCD Project, Odisha

The Project has been functioning since April 2018. Gram Shakti CFCD project is running in 21 villages in the interior part of the Kalahandi district, touching the lives of weaker sections. These villages are inhabited by downtrodden people belonging to the tribal and non-tribal communities (SC, ST & OBC). The main occupation of people is Agriculture. The project has

successfully implemented all the planned activities of the reporting year. In this year there was less rainfall, which affected the crop yield of most farmers.

The project had the following objectives:

- Provision for better healthcare facilities for the community and improved quality of health and hygiene.
- 100% enrolment of children in schools and improved quality of the teaching-learn ing process and overall literacy rate.
- Improved economic conditions and the living standards of the target community by improving livelihood options through agriculture, soil & water conservation, and other income generation activities.
- Independent functioning and management of CBOs and people take up leadership

#### 4. Rural Education



The motto and vision of CARD, KhristSevaKendra(KSK) is to enlighten the surrounding of Sunwani village. Child development, women empowerment, health care, agriculture developments have created a place in the heart of the people around. KSK is a well-known education center located in St. Thomas Higher Secondary School, Kshipra, Madhya Pradesh. KSK was of great help to the communities during the imbalances of the Covid-19 period.

Today KSK stands with a great reputation as a community development organisation and it will enable them to move towards freedom from poverty. Lack of quality education is one of the major problems that Dewas district has been facing. Lack of infrastructure, non-availability of qualified teachers, and absence of teachers in the Government schools are some issues which contributed to this situation. CARD – KSK tried to address this problem by starting a few schools with primary education as the priority. Following schools are serving the community to improve education.

- St. Thomas Higher Secondary School, Dewas, MP
- SarvodayaVidhyalayaShanthi Nagar,
- Easow Mar Themothios Memorial Hostel



### **KSK Campus**

The green campus spread over 7 acres of land promotes organic farming and animal rearing. The different varieties of birds, domestic animals improved the magnetism of the campus. In Association with United Theological Seminary, two Seminary students from United Theological Seminary, Bangalore successfully completed their practical training at Kshipra during the year.

The people around Kshipra trust, encourage, and stand with this organisation as hundreds of volunteers contributed themselves to the wellbeing of the community and won their love and confidence. KSK is working with a vision to ensure the justice of all people.

# 5. Health Programmes

#### **CARD Suraksha Project**

**CARD** Suraksha Project was started in August 2009 with financial and technisupport cal from Kerala State **AIDS** Control Society (KSACS). The goal of the project is to take proactive approaches to halt and reverse the HIV/ADIS prevalence in the project area



(Kottarakara, Veliyam, Perumpuzha. Punalur, Kadackal, Anchal, Chadayamanagalam, Kulath-upuzha, Aryankavu, and Pathanapuram) through implementing the targeted intervention among the Female Sex worker in this area. Now we have 820 Sex workers in our Project area. With the help of a peer educator (Selected and trained Sex worker) and secondary stake-holders (those who supported our programme for identifying new Sex worker), we provide health-related support like HIV testing, STI Screening, condom promotion & distribution, IEC distribution, counseling, facilities of Health camps, etc. Now we have 14 Peer Centre Units, each having approximately 60 HRG's (Sex worker in the category High-Risk Group).

In our Project office, the following is the Staff structure

- Out Reach Worker (ORW's)

Now we have 3 ORW's. The ORW's are controlling managers of Peer Educators. Peer Educator



is a Voluntary worker, who are given a small amount of honorarium and TA every month for supporting the Project activities. We depend on the Govt Health facility system for receiving all the above-mentioned service uptakes. The activities also include mobilizing the HRG's, project implementing deferent community events and Celebration, IGP Training and Programmes.

## 6. Agriculture & Food security

Agriculture and food security programs aim to improve rural livelihoods through sustainably increasing agricultural production sales and enhancing food security for the poor. Food security can be measured bν calorie intake per person per day, available on a

household budget. In general, the objective of food security indicators and measures is to capture some or all of the main components of food security in terms of food availability, access, and utilization or adequacy.

Food is a basic human need and right. Food security ensures that people have enough basic food at all times and provide them with energy and nutrients. Availability of food, access to food, quality, and nutritional value, and stability in provision are the main areas where food security is concerned. To improve agriculture and empower farmers is an urgent need towards achieving food security in India.

# ICAR KrishiVigyan Kendra (KVK), CARD, Pathanamthitta

KrishiVigyanKendras (KVK) are agricultural extension centers set up in various districts in India. CARD-KrishiVigyan Kendra, Pathanamthitta was established by ICAR on 25th March 1995 to ensure technology backstopping to farming community and extension mechanism of Pathanamthitta.

The year 2019-2020 is the Silver jubilee of KVK's existence in serving the farming community of Pathanamthitta District. The motto of the silver jubilee year was SERVE, CONSERVE, and RESERVE. As part of the celebration, 25 programmes were scheduled for the year to create a better future for the farming community. A silver jubilee logo was also released that



demotes KVKs 25 years of service towards the farming community with the best agricultural technologies, that are ecologically safe, farmer-friendly, and which are economically viable. It symbolizes the immense efforts of the institution to create a better future for the



farming community and at the same time looking out for our environment protecting and caring the nature, in order to pass on to our future generation, something major than what we have received.

Interventions aiming to support the farmers with climate-resilient agriculture and enhance their income at the adopted villages of Nirnanam, Peringara, and Kadapra were the major activities of the silver jubilee. With an objective of entrepreneurial development in the youth of rural areas to take up various agriculture and allied service sector enterprises for suitable



income and successful employment, another programme ARYA (Attracting and Retaining Youth in Agriculture) was also implemented during the year. KVK also implemented a Koipuram Block sponsored project "Employment opportunities for differently-abled children through agriculture-based interventions" The project empowered 25 differently-abled children and made them self-reliant in sectors like poultry farming, Quail farming, and vegetable cultivation. Celebration of important days, a 10th-year celebration of Mukulam

(an initiative for the promotion of biodiversity conservation and climate change among school children), the 5th-year celebration of Krishi Jaalakam (community radio program in collaboration with Radiomacfast90.4), training to farmers and officials from ASEAN countries, workshops, seminars, Kisan Mela, exhibitions, publications, technology transfer on value addition of jackfruit were some other programmes during the silver jubilee year.

## 7. Livelihood Activities

Livelihood activities are about minimum conditions for living a life with dignity. CARD has been focusing on livelihood promotion programs with the motive of increasing the employment opportunities for rural women and youth.

# 8. Government Programmes

#### i. Awareness of Medicinal plants cultivation

'Arogyavum Abhivridhiyum Ousahdha Krishiyiloode' (health & wealth through medicinal plant cultivation)—a Seminar exclusively for the tribal community in Wayanad District, intended for conservation and perpetuation of medicinal plants.



A one-day seminar had conducted by incorporating people who were shortlisted by the survey conducted. The participants were around 80 and it was conducted on World Environmental day of 2019 at Nadavayal KudumbaSamithy Office. The programme was officially been inaugurated by Sri. C K Saseendran MLA (Kalpetta constituency). He talked about the importance of preserving those plants which are on the verge of extinction and those hereditary treatments. He also emphasized the financial requirements come by it for the better-



rment of local people. So these programmes add immense value to the purpose of helping

The people are not aware of our natural plants and medicines nor about the usages and treatments of it, which eventually destroy our health. These programmes

The seminar was organised with the support of the Kerala State Medicinal Plants Board (SMPB). The medicinal plant cultivation programme was inaugurated by Dr. Sanal Kumar (State Medicinal Plants Board). He also distributed different types of medicinal saplings to 20 tribal families. He explained that it is important to make value-based products by the plants of farmers which ensures financial security for the farmers in the programme. He also promised his support for all the future activities.

Shri. K.P George, Vanamoolika has led the workshops on "Management of medicinal plants cultivation "and "Preparation of herbal value-added products". He also discussed the herbal varieties cultivated in Wayanad and its importance. He demonstrates the preparation of different type of value added products from herbal medicines like Murivenna and Pain Balm etc. He also shared some of the methods to preserve and grow these plants. 40 tribal

farmers had agreed and registered to collect the herbal plants from the interiors of the forest of Wayanad.

Visit of Vanamoolika, Pulpally, and Kerala Ayurveda cooperative Society, drug factory, Calicut

By visiting the Ayurveda cooperative Society, drug factory, Calicut the people could understand the wide





scope of the herbal medicines and the plants. The visitors could also get a glimpse into the process of making medicines and also the varieties of plants use to make medicines.

Visited Vanamoolika, Pulappally to observe the different types of medicinal plants and their importance. It was also helpful in understanding the cultivation methods and the financial importance of it.

### ii. One-day Awareness Seminar - "Climate Change in Wayanad"

CARD had organised a one-day environmental-based seminar 'Issues and challenges faced

by the territory of Wayanad due to climate change ' by the sponsorship of Directorate of Environment & Climate Change, Govt. of Kerala held 28th on January 2020 at the Co-operative Bank auditorium Pulpally Wayanad.

The seminar aimed at creating

knowledge among the people on the impacts of climate change in the daily life of people. It also analysed various strategies that can be implemented at the local level to tackle the issue

in the state, especially in the district of Wayanad.

The inauguration of the programme was facilitated by Sri. I.C Balakrishnan MLA (SulthanBathery) by lighting up the lamp with all participated guests in the workshop. As per him "we can't simply criticize the factors of the climate change; traditional farming methods and organic farming are the key concepts to overcome the issues. It is needed to adopt these methods of farming which should be sustainable

and can restore the fertility of the soil. People should realize that afforestation is the only



solution against global warming, and collective responsibility is needed among the public to protect our ecosystem for us as well as the future generation". Smt.Bindhu Prakash (Presi-



dent, Pulpally Grama Panchayath) presided over the meeting.

The legendary and traditional farmer Shri.Cheruvayal Raman of Wayanad was honoured in the programme. He is an environmental activist and general council member of Kerala Agricultural University, Mannoothy, Thrissur. He had made an interactive discussion with the participants and said the importance of preserving traditional seeds and traditional methods of farming. Shri. K. J Paul

(Vice President, Pulpallypanchayath) and Mr Jossey Kurien (Treasurer, CARD) had talked about the difficulties faced by the people of Wayanad due to flood and drought and also due to climate changes. After the inaugural session Sri. Dr. Dineshan V. P (IWRD, Rtd. Senior Principal and Scientist) had taken a class on 'Issues and Challenges' faced by Wayanad due to climate change and the second session was handled by Prof. K. Balagopal (Kerala SastraSahitya Parishad). The topic of discussion for the session was the actions to prevent these climate change and related issues.

There were 156 people including college and school students, farmers, social activists etc. participated in the programme. After the seminar, the participants had a discussion on the issues and points raised in the seminar by social media and they started a WhatsApp group to express their views and develop certain sustainable methods to prevent natural calamities and to protect the Mother Nature. Around 82 members are active in the group at present.

## 11. Kerala Flood & Landslide Response 2019

Short Term Relief work at NilamburMalapuram District.

#### **OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT**

- 1. Help and engage in government rescue operations
- 2. Distribute Kitchen utensils for those who lost it in the Disaster Flood
- 3. Distribute clothes and blankets to keep them from extreme cold climatic



The north-eastern part of Malappuram and neighbouring regions were submerged underwater. The incessant rain from 7th to 11th August 2019 caused overwhelming floods and



landslides which caused large-scale damage to roads, bridges, houses, communication, power supplies, infrastructure, crops, the livelihood of thousands of people.

CARD targeted 3 Panchayaths in Nilambur Block which were badly affected by the flood Landslide. They were Mukkam&Illikad tribal colonies, Kootatapady, Perumbilad, Kootapady, Chalikapetti, Menonpotti villages.





**TARGET GROUPS / BENEFICIARIES** 

All these areas are almost 8 to 15 kilometers away from Nilambur town.

The Utensils kit distribution reached 464 families

Villages were based on empirical surveys, personal visit,s and observations. The basic bottom line requirement was whether the people are affected severely in floods and are they need immediate attention for their survival.

- 1. Village highly affected by floods
- 2. There are marginalized populations with a low-income background
- 3. Similar support (relief packages that are essential) has not arrived yet in the locality. Liaison with local administration is very important to let the local administration aware of the relief support reaching the community in focus.

# **Report in Detail**

# 1. Child Support Programmes

I. CARD Gramasakti CFCD(Child Focused Community Development Project, Kalhandi , Odisha)

CARD - Gram Shakti CFCD Project has been functioning from April 2018. The CFCD project is running in 21 villages in the interior part of the Kalahandi district touching the life of weaker sections. These villages are inhabited by downtrodden people belonging SC, ST and other back ward communities.



The main activities under the project as follows

#### Health & Nutrition:

- Distributed Chhatua as a supplementary food to 392 malnourished children
- Project has conducted 3 awareness programmes and 196 community people were actively participated in this programme.
- Conducted one health camp at Biripadi Cluster and provided basic health check-up along with health awareness to community with the help of 3 doctors. In this medi cal camp 172 people did the health check-up and it was diagnosed as most of them suffered due to malaria.
- Project conducted one training for the pregnant and lactating mothers for taking care of new born and through this programme 59 community people are covered.
- To provide portable drinking water project has constructed three dug well at 3 remote villages namely Damgaon, Padeli and Kachelaku.
- Two awareness programme were conducted with the participation of 100 commu nity people on construction of safe latrine and uses it regular for the good sanita tion condition in the village.
- A networking programme was organised with active participation of community people, PRI members, School teachers, Anganwadi workers, ASHA worker and other Government Officials.



- Project organised one capacity building training for Anganwadi workers and 53 mem bers were participated.
- The project distributed learning material like Chhabillabarnabodha (Odia learning book), note book, pen and pencil to 658 school going children.
- Project distributed sports material to each children parliament and in all project villages.
- Project organised two cultural programme in which children participated actively and shown their talents through different cultural activities.
- The baseline survey unveiled the lack of quality education in this project area due to irregularity of school teachers and inadequate facilities. To fill the gap and to minimize the addressed issue the project organised a networking meeting with the active participation of 35 community people, PRI members and school teachers.
- Project distributed 1000 Blanket to poor children in connection with New Year
- To mobilize the youth power and to bring active participation of the youth in village development activities the project has conducted 4 life skills training on youth leadership on village development.
- Project organised 3 month tailoring training for adolescent girls and newly married women to make them self-reliant. Through this training programme 20 members are benefited.

# **Livelihood Development:**

- Constructed one check weir at Lahadi village. The main objective of this activity is to improve irrigation facility in farming, through which 45 families are currently benefiting. This is expected that even after an irregular rain there will be no crop fail.
- Repair two water diversion trench in Lubengarh villages out of which almost 60 families got benefit of good irrigation facility.
- Two Earthen Nalla bund has been deepen and repaired at Biripadi and pangabaju village. The objective of implementing this activity is to reduce soil erosion of the farming land



and also to improve irrigation facilities.

- One earthen canal has constructed at Pangabaju village for irrigation purpose.
- With the active participation of the community people the project successfully supported to 48 marginal farmers to have Farm bunding in their barren land, many of them are started paddy cultivation in that treated land. The project proud to share that the crop yield of target families will increase.
- The project supported 14 families to construct NADEP compost pit.
   Purpose of this initiative is to encourage famers for doing organic farming.
- The project has supported one family to start a Small hotel in the village and 9 families supported to run a petty shop, 1family for



- black smith, one family for fancy shop in their respective villages.
- To empower them economically project taken an initiative to promote goat rearing programme through Self-help groups. To carry out this activities project has given financial support to 79 members of 7 self-help group in different villages
- To promote the horticulture in the project area the project has distributed 1700 mango saplings and farmers were planted it successfully and taking care of it.

# Community Mobilisation/Capacity Building:

• To give knowledge regarding the bank systems and its importance the project conducted one networking programme between women SHGs and bankers.

tance of their participation in development work in the family as well as in the village.

- In the occasion of International Women's Day the project organised its celebration with the participation of more than 500 women from the different project villages.
- The project has conducted 5 training for the various CBOs like VDC,VEC, youth group, Farmers Group, watershed committee etc. In this programme 296 leaders from the various CBOs were participated
- 82 Women from the project villages were taken for exposure to Odisha livelihood mission project at Madanpur cluster of M. Rampur Block it resulted in to gain of new knowledge and techniques and encouraged them to initiate model activities.
- 2 Training were conducted for the community people regarding the various Govt. Schemes, so that they can grave the benefit out of it. In this training programme project mainly focused on Pradhanmantri Avas Yojana, MGNREGS and Bijuswastya Kalyan Yojana etc.

#### **Children in Governance:**

• In this reporting period project has formed one more children parliament and now there are 13 CPs and in which 414 children are actively participating. To strengthen and

motivate children to take part in the developmental process of the villas, the project conducted 8 train ing. Through this training CP children being taught the effective functioning of CP, Purpose of CP, Role and responsibility of different minister in the CP and also the various social issues related to their respective village.

 To give adequate knowledge on child rights to children and community



people the project was conducted 7 training and in this programme 372 community people were participated.

- One children seminar was organised by the HCDI at Ranchi and form our project 6 CP members and 2 staff were participated. To educate children in child rights and at the same to make aware community people in the same, the project also organised cluster wise 4 children seminar and in this programme 520 children were participated.
- The project conducted 3 training for the members of child protection committee.



#### **Protection and Conservation of Environment:**

- The project organised 3 training and 169 community people were participated. Through this training they realised the reasons of climate change, its impact on livelihood, health and environment and also the possible adaptive measure in the local area.
- The project conducted 3 training programme to equip them to aware the best and optimum use of natural resources with the active participation of 152 community people on natural resource management.
- The project conducted two awareness cum training programme to give knowledge about the mitigation and prevention of natural disaster for community people and 137 people were took part in this training programme.

### **Networking and Advocacy for Child Rights:**

The project activities extended its network continuously with various Govt. officials like Panchayat members, Anganwadi workers, ASHA workers and school teachers to mobilise the local resources for the community development and also to have smooth functioning of the Govt. systems. Definitely their service will help the holistic development of the Project target area.

CARD Light to Life projects aim at the holistic development of Children . The project works





### IV. Agriculture and Food security

ICAR KVK, Pathanamthitta
Empowerment of Special Youth through Agriculture Based Interventions

Children with disabilities in India are subject to multiple deprivations and limited opportunities in several dimensions of their lives. Their families and care givers also go through lot of stress and challenges in having a person with disability at home which ultimately leads to severe discriminatory practices towards these children. These differently abled children need to be equipped to be self reliant. The agriculture activity based soft skills could provide them with ample scope for self-employment opportunity. Realizing the complex nature of problems of the disabled children, a unique first ever Opportunity Learning Centre (OLC) for developing skills among special children was set up by ICAR-KrishiVigyan Kendra, CARD, Pathanamthitta attached to Christian Agency for Rural Development (CARD). This unique project was funded by National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD).To establish units at household level and to empower special children the project titled "Employment Opportunities for individuals with intellectual disabilities in agriculture based interventions" was sanctioned by Koipuram Block Panchayat through ICDS. Trainings to develop the skills of the selected special child were provided by KVK, Pathanamthitta by using various Tailor made Information Education Communication (IEC) materials. A total of 25 Special youth and their families were benefitted from the



projects. Enterprises selected included Poultry rearing under cage system, Quail rearing in cages and Growing vegetables in grow bags, problems of the disabled children, a unique first ever Opportunity Learning Centre (OLC) for developing skills among special children was set up by ICAR-KrishiVigyan Kendra, CARD, Pathanamthitta attached to Christian Agency for Rural Development (CARD). This unique project was funded by National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD).To establish units at household level and to empower special children the project titled "Employment Opportunities for individuals with intellectual disabilities in agriculture based interventions" was sanctioned by Kojpuram Block Panchayat through ICDS. This project aimed to equip the special children selected from Koipuram Block to be self reliant and to strengthen the skills of children above 18 years of age with a possible self employment opportunity in agriculture and allied sectors. Various income generating units with vocational rehabilitation possibilities was set up at the selected special child\( \text{S} \) house for making him or herself reliant. Trainings to develop the skills of the selected special child were provided by KVK, Pathanamthitta by using various Tailor made Information Education Communication (IEC) materials. ### **Freshwater Cage Fish Farming**

In order to promote cage fish farming in the KVK's operational villages of Upper Kunttanad, KVK conducted a Front Line Demonstration and Farmer Field School on Fresh water cage fish farming at Niranam Panchayat and Kadapra Panchayat. The floods in the watershed areas, especially in the Upper Kuttanad region, was a major setback to fish farming Farmers were trained in different aspects of Cage Fish farming. Topics like Scope of Cage fish farming in flood prone areas, Feed management, Construction of Fish cages, Disease management were covered during the trainings. A method demonstration on Stocking of Fingerlings in cages was also conducted. A vocational training on freshwater cage fish farming was

conducted from 25th October to 28th October 2019 at Pulikeezhu block as part of Farmer Field School. The training included sessions on orientation training on cage fish farming and Hands on experience training on cage fabrication, nursery management, feed and nutrition and disease management. A total of 23 farmers participated in the training programme.

### **Attracting and Retaining Youth in Agriculture (Arya)**


According to national youth policy, persons in the age group of 15-35 are defined as young. At present, 35% of the total population is in the age group of 15-35 years, out of which 75% live in rural areas. Migration of rural youth to cities is around 45% in the country, and it is estimated that only about 5% of youth are engaged in agriculture. There are challenges in empowering the youth to improve their skills and to remain in the



agriculture as a source of livelihood in rural situation. Creation of successful economic models in the villages is crucial to catalyse and energize youth to become entrepreneurs in rural areas and guide others in their vicinity. Realizing the importance of rural youth in

agricultural development especially from the point of view of food security of the country and to empower rural youth, the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) has initiated a programme on "Attracting and Retaining Youth in Agriculture (ARYA) during 2015-16.Under this scheme, special efforts are being taken up to attract the rural youth under the age of 35 years in agriculture to provide income generating opportunities and engage them in agriculture. KVK initiated ARYA project during the 2019-20. Four enterprises namely BV380 poultry layer egg production unit, Honey production unit, value addition of Jackfruit and Rambutan and Tomato Nursery unit were sanctioned under the ARYA scheme for KVK, Pathanamthitta. During the year a total of 65 youth were empowered in the selected enterprises. 36 trainings were conducted as part of the project.



### **LIVELIHOOD Activities**

### **CARD - HARIPAD UNIT**

This has formed in order to provide vocational training to the needy and economically weak youths in area surroundings of Haripad village of Alappuzha District. CARD has started this Unit in the year 1990. CARD – Haripad unit is providing training in Tailoring & Embroidery. The Unit raises their income through the sale of its products like furniture, Communion Syrup, Squash, Wafer, Candle, Incense, and Honey.

The better home organized 6 months tailoring training programme with collaboration of EHA a Delhi based NGO. The target peoples were from poor and heavy flood affected areas in 2018 flood. 25 women were selected from flood affected areas








Wayanad district consists of people of the tribal communities including Paniya, Adiya, Urali and Kattunaika. CARD light to life project functions at Nadavayal and concerning these communities. One of its foster colony named Pathiriyambam consists of people of Paniya and Kattunaika. They are the backward community and soley depend on the daily wage jobs. These daily wages are their livelihood. They are not bothered about the future and not have the habit of saving for the future. So that they are not giving importance to give proper education to the children of their community Parents take these children to the jobs they do and eventually these children learn it and do it. They even take their children for help in seasonal jobs such as coffee seeds plucking, aricanut plucking etc.

The children will get meagre amount of money and this kills their interest in learning and will go for more work. Parents will not take any serious effort in sending the children who are lazy to the class. These children take more time in mingling with other children in the school and most commenly they get be friended with children of their cast and

group.
Ajith Gangan is a child from Pathiriyambam colony who was the a part our project even from the very beginning of the project when he was four years old. But he is not a regular going student to the school. Neither do the parents take care of him in academic matters. When the project started the tuition for children, teacher would go and take these children to the centre. Because the centre offers food and play time he became a regular comer. In the initial days he didn't mingle with any other students. Gradually he started to get close to other students and he starts drawing pictures. Now he learned letters and numbers upto ten.

Every student who is a regular comer to the tuition centres show a progressive change in their studies. But Ajith, Mrudula and Sanidya needs special mention and applause as they show remarkable changes.



### **SUCCESS STORY/CASE STUDY**

"Friends of Coconut"- a helping hand for Coconut farmers

Coconut farmers, used to harvest the palm once in 45-60 days, had to change the frequency to once in three or four months as they faced acute shortage of trained hands. The traditional coconut climbers are a vanishing lot due to social upliftment their community received. Even though more than thirty lakhs unemployed youths have registered with state employment exchange, farmers in many areas were forced to seek help of migrant laborers who charge exorbitant rate for coconut plucking. Elevation of status is the only solution to sustain this profession in the state where farmers are in dire need of coconut puckers'. The absence of coconut pluckers is a major hindrance in timely harvest of coconuts which ultimately grow farmers disinterest on coconut cultivation and leave gardens unmanaged which lead to drastic decline in the production and productivity of coconut besides faster decline in the area under cultivation. To bring a solution to this issue KVK joined hands with Coconut Development Board(CDB) and trained 122 rural youth on scientific management of coconut and mechanized coconut climbing who would be known as friends of coconut tree "lending a helping hand to farmers in harvesting and management of coconut gardens in the district.

The trainings were residential scheduled for 6 days in such a way that topics like mechanized coconut climbing, scientific coconut management and hands on training on different cultural practices in coconut pest and disease management were covered. Beside this HRD topics like Yoga, time management, development of communication skills, etc. were also included. Trainees who attended the training were given free lodging and boarding besides a stipend of Rs 75/day and a coconut climber. An insurance coverage of one lakh was taken from first day of training up to one year. Uniform, mobile handset, loan for purchase of two-wheeler are the additional facilities CDB is

time or part time. One of the participant Mr. Vipin Varghese, Poonthopil,

Aikad, Kodumon a Higher Secondary student is going for coconut climbing

on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays earning an income of more than Rupees Four thousand per month. He has brought a two-wheeler using bank loan and he

is able to re-pay the amount from his income. Traditional climbers who are using mechanized climber say that they are more comfortable with this because there is less strain while climbing and harvesting. Where rubber is cultivated as the major crop and coconut is cultivated in scattered areas, they are able to climb more than 30 palms in a day. However in areas where coconut is the major crop they are able to harvest nuts from at least 60 palms a day. On an average the climbers were able to climb 50 palms per day. They are able to identify various pests and diseases in coconut and able to practice scientific managements for its control .They are also recommending manures, fertilizers and various cultural practices for better scientific management of coconut. The climbers are able to get on an average 20 days of work per month, where they charge Rs.20-25/palm depending on the height and number of palms in a garden. Besides these they are also entitled to collect 2 nuts per 100 harvested nuts.

Each climber on an average earns Rs16, 000-20,000/month making it yet another remunerative job. A group among these climbers has registered labour group and are now engaged in seed nut collection, raising was rupees 500 per o nursery, seedling planting, maintenance of coconut palms etc.


